MT DEATH INDEX CD - UPDATE-2008-2012

The Montana State Genealogical Society has created a 3rd Montana State Death Index CD that covers deaths in the State from 2008 to 2012. This update is available for a price of \$10. The 2nd CD for years 2003-2007 is still available for \$10. This will be a great addition to the original CD, which covers all the deaths reported to the State from the 1800s through 2002. Most of the records give the person's age and the county where they died. The data is in Microsoft ACCESS format in 10 year searchable increments if you don't know exact information. Included on the CD is a current list of Montana Counties, their numbers, and addresses. There is a helpful "read-me" file that explains some of the intricacies of the database. Unexpected Souvenir

In June, 2022 I visited the Stevens County Museum in Morris, MN, desiring to have a picture taken of me with the name panel from my great-great grandfather's metal grave monument. On a genealogy trip of June-July, 2010, I learned a lot but I was disappointed in not finding my main priority items -- my great grandfather Peter's and great-great grandfather Casper Wulf's burial sites. At the supposed location of a cemetery north of Johnson, MN, all I could find was one tombstone in the open and what appeared to be one surrounded by 1-inch diameter lilacs growing about 4-6 inches apart in a patch 50-100 feet in diameter. Heat, bugs and uncertainty that I was in the right place made me continue the trip without further searching.


Little did I know I would be handed this info on the proverbial silver platter!

Returning home from an early September sightseeing trip to the west coast, I found an email waiting for me. The correspondent had seen the picture of granduncle Fred that I'd posted on FindAGrave immediately after my return from Minnesota and asked how I was related. She and a fellow staff member of the Morris, Stevens County, MN museum had talked with people in the Chokio newspaper office and got interested in documenting the abandoned cemetery I'd found but not explored. She had found Wulf relatives that included the great and great-great grandfathers I'd been seeking and the sister of the granduncle I'd posted. Her crew spent 2 ½ hours hacking into the lilac thicket I'd found too daunting, then 5 hours documenting and erecting fallen tombstones. In addition to four with the surname Wulf, five Westphal's (my great grandmother Augusta's maiden name) and a Ludwig (the son of Augusta and her second husband Amandus Ludwig) were found. Of the 20 monuments found, 10 are my relatives! The cemetery and all occupants are now listed on FindAGrave as the German Methodist Cemetery of Traverse County, MN.

In a further stroke of luck, a monument made of metal but missing the identification panel turned out to be my great-great grandfather Casper's. After the cemetery was vandalized 25 years earlier, the piece with his name and a German inscription had been found in a ditch and turned in to the museum. As far as I know, none of the staff is related to anyone in the cemetery. They were doing the work out of personal curiosity. They even found someone to translate the German inscriptions! I have since received from them a binder with pictures of all the monuments and the text found on them.

On a trip to the museum in 2010, I got side-tracked by some historical exhibits and forgot to ask about the panel and get my picture taken with it. When I went to the museum this time and asked to see the panel, the curator disappeared for a while and brought the panel to me. Before I could pose for a picture with it, he asked me if I wanted it. A bit of paperwork later and I walked out the door with it in my hands! Evidently a small county museum is not interested in storing items of historic significance only to another county.
